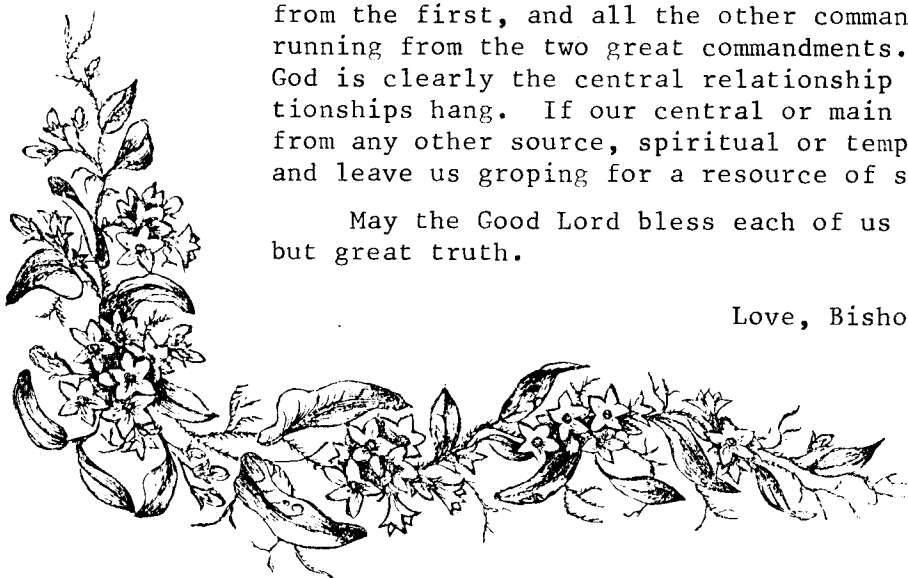
Thou shalt love the Lord thy God with all thy heart, and with all thy soul, and with all thy mind.

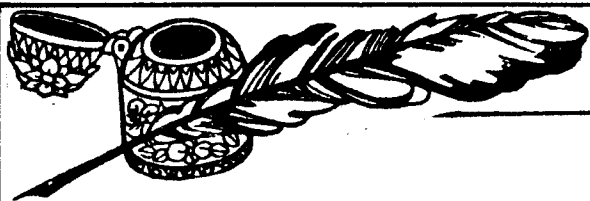
Thou shalt love thy neighbor as thyself.

He says the language is coming quite easily to him, and to the surprise of both he and his companion, they were quite successful getting inside doors.

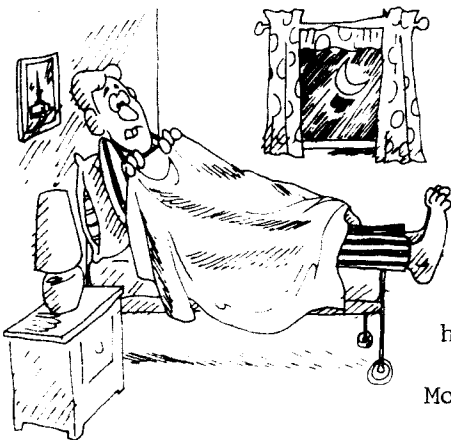
We received a very nice letter from John's Mission President and his wife with a picture of both of them with John. He is starting his mission in Norrkoping, Sweden.

Butler Third has excellent cooks! One meal that Clay especially liked was described as being fit for a king! He had seconds that night.

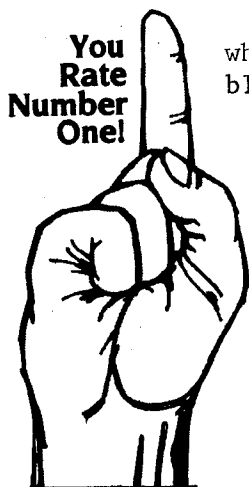
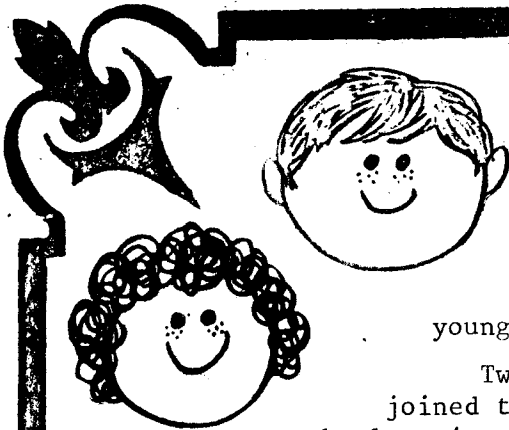
One day as I lay in bed I wished I had some brownies. That evening, brownies were on my kitchen table -- my wish came true.

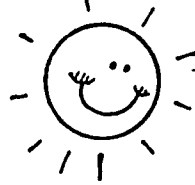

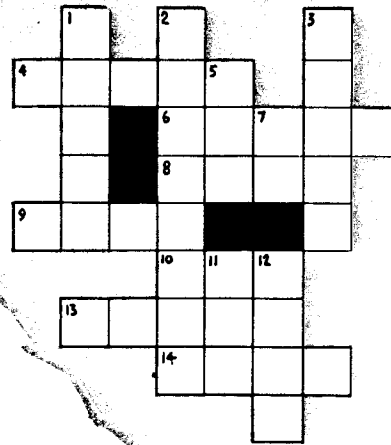




Wedding
