He was really getting worried and told his companion that he could pick him up in jail. He had visions of being behind bars. As it turned out, everyone was checked for documents except Mike. He knew that Someone was looking out for him.

On his one of his p-days, Mike & comp went to a winery where one of the investigators works. They saw wine being bottled, labled, packaged & fermented. That winery could hold seven million liters of wine. Mendoza is the wine capitol of Argentina. The missionaries were offered a bottle, but of course they refused it.

Mike wrote the letter on his "slump" day---18 months in the missionfield. He couldn't believe it had gone so quickly. We hope Mike has his documents now in case he is stopped & checked again.


CHRIS SCHARMAN has gone to Taiwan where he has a job teaching English to nursery and pre-school age child-ren.


