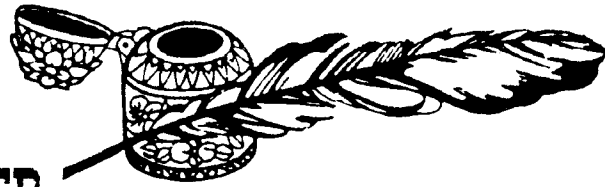


Happiness puts enthusiasm in one's heart, a twinkle in our eyes, a glow on our faces, and a radiance into our souls.

The "Brighton Banner is greatly appreciated, and helps us keep up on the local happenings. Our congratulations to the Herzogs on their new calling. If we have the opportunity we will stop at Nauvoo to visit.

The people treat us so well here that we enjoy our mission more all the time. The church is growing with several baptisms each month. We're still looking for a good location to build a chapel. Sometime in the future there will be a temple built in northern England. The Catholic Church has a large tract of land next to their St. Joseph College which they have tried to sell. It would be a nice area for a stake house and temple with plenty of room for gardens, parking and sports. However, land is very expensive here, compared to Utah.

Our work with part active and inactive members is rewarding when we find a family who seem to be waiting for a little encouragement and help. One mother and her teenage son and daughter had put us off several times with excuses; but finally swallowed their pride and let us meet with them. They are now friendly and open. We hope they will become active and enjoy the fellowship with others in the ward permanently. On the other side some get offended and take up with their old habits and become inactive. For some strange reason, some think this is getting even with their offenders. One sister said she wished Sir Walter Ralieggh had never brought tobacco to England.

President, Paul Davis, and I have been taking English driving lessons. He says the lessons are making him a poorer driver instead of better. But we have to pass the English driving test for our license to use English roads. After nine lessons my instructor felt I had overcome all my bad American driving habits and was ready for the test! I had some very anxious moments before passing the drivers test.

The enclosed clippings show that other churches in England have problems over marriage status as well as the L.D.S. One wonders if marriage by legal means is a thing of the past. The children suffer greatly from the lack of a stable family home. Honorable dedicated parents are the exception in many societies over the world. Truly the world is ripening toward destruction. It is a real joy to have a family repent and accept the gospel whole heartedly.

Mike wrote the letter on his "slump" day---18 months in the missionfield. He couldn't believe it had gone so quickly. We hope Mike has his documents now in case he is stopped & checked again.

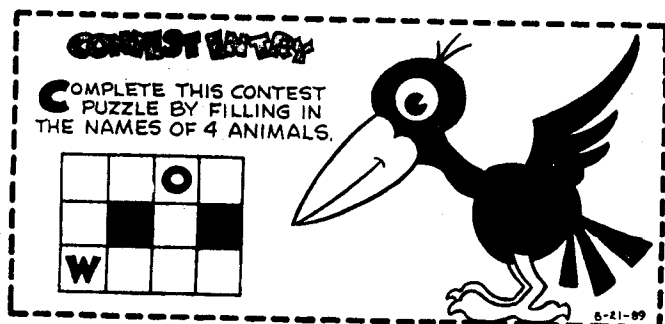

CLIF & IRIS BEATTIE won the prize for having the largest family at Iris' 25th year high school reunion. This was held in Wisconsin.

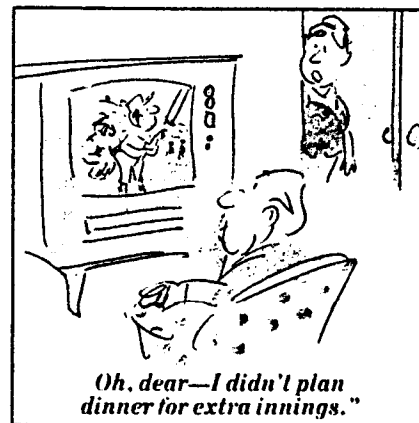

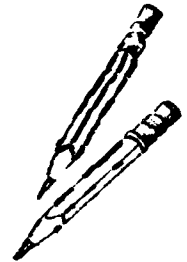
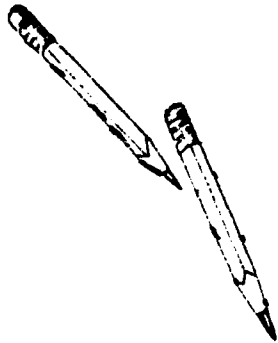

Georgia was born in New Mexico with much of her early childhood spent on a small ranch in Sanders, Arizona. Here her father farmed the land & provided maintenance for the seven children & mother. Georgia developed a tremendous love for the ranch with its windmill, water storage pond, red windy roadways, old farm house, dogs, cats & a hundred other simple, appreciated elements of life on the ranch. In 1948 Georgia was converted to the LDS Church, she being the only member of the family to join at the time. She came to Provo & attended BYU, & by the turn of 1951 was married in the Salt Lake Temple.

Earl was born in Garland, Utah, came to Salt Lake City at age one, attended grade school at Sumner & Garfield Schools, Junior High at Irving Junior High in Sugarhouse, and High School at East & South, with graduation from South High. Earl graduated from Radio Institute, SLC. One of his first jobs was a position as master control operator audio engineer with Radio Station KSL. The assignment involved controlling every sound coming from the Columbia Broadcasting System, and observing & monitoring every local KSL originated program, including Tabernacle Choir, Sunday LDS programs, and all General Conferences of the Church. This was an excellent job, but the pressure intense! Over the years Earl labored in the electronic field with his last assignment being a five year stint with the physics department of the U of U.

Georgia & Earl met at a Western States Missionary Reunion and were married a few months later. Our history in the Butler-Cottonwood Heights area proceeds back to 1955. These were the early times when there were few houses, & the only 11

They were the Wilf Hansen's, the Browns, The Congers, The Covington's, the Lindgrens and a few others. We have witnessed the establishment of four service stations on Highland Drive and 70th South, & every speck of building on Bengal Blvd, all the establishment of Hillside Plaza, the 62nd South buildup, all the Highland Drive 70th South businesses, the erection of 20,000 houses (or whatever the figure is), the erection of all the schools, except the grade school on the top of the hill, all the chapels except one on top of the famous 70th South hill where we attended meetings, the dragging in of the liquor store to our glorious area, all the fancy recreational facilities, and the stop lights. We were aware of the expansion of the water treatment facilities at Big Cottonwood & Danish Road, the creation of the various parks, & the ambitious church constructions, wherein we donated labor for the various sites.

While living in Butlerville we were blessed with eight children & at present we have 10 grandchildren. It is, indeed enjoyable to visit with each of our children & grandchildren.

## SCHOOL DAYS

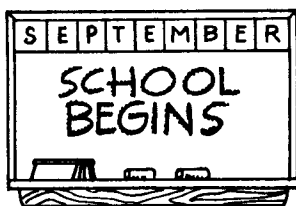
The process of learning begins at birth and continues throughout ones life. It is interesting to watch a young baby develop and learn by watching others & imitating their actions. At first he will respond by a smile, by reaching, by touching. As he gets older he develops more skills (physical) and explores his world by crawling & getting into things.

Through 13 years of formal education, fascinating worlds can be opened up to students. This education mainly comes through other peoples experience or wisdom. We build upon knowledge accumulated after many centuries of progress. Books used to be about the only medium that schools had to teach from. Books are wonderful and much can be learned by reading. Nowadays, through the medium of TV and videos that are available in all classrooms and homes, students can actually "see and watch" history being made, and can watch enactments of past history.

We should all be grateful for the opportunities we have for acquisition of knowledge either through formal education or by our own study outside the classroom.

We should all be grateful for concerned and dedicated teachers who make learning a joy. Teachers deserve our support. They deserve our thanks. They deserve our respect.

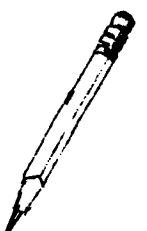
