

ALMA 34: 32-34

AUGUST 1992

32: FOR BEHOLD, THIS LIFE IS THE TIME FOR MEN TO PREPARE TO MEET GOD: YEA, BEHOLD THE DAY OF THIS LIFE IS THE DAY FOR MEN TO PERFORM THEIR LABORS.

Several years ago I proposed this question to my Sunday School class. Q. Have you sinned all you want to....? RESPONSE: Many of the students age 14-15 didn't want to admit that they had not yet sinned all they wanted to.

The general authorities have cautioned our youth against thinking it is OK to stray a little and taste of the things of this world, the so called pleasures, and then repent, take a few months to get things straight and go on a mission or through the temple, etc.

33: AND NOW AS I SAID UNTO YOU BEFORE, AS YE HAVE HAD SO MANY WITNESS. THEREFORE, I BESEECH OF YOU THAT YE DO NOT PROCRASTINATE THE DAY OF YOUR REPENTANCE UNTIL THE END; FOR AFTER THIS DAY OF LIFE, WHICH IS GIVEN US TO PREPARE FOR ETERNITY, BEHOLD, IF WE DO NOT IMPROVE OUR TIME WHILE IN THIS LIFE, THEN COMETH THE NIGHT OF DARKNESS WHEREIN THERE CAN BE NO LABOR PERFORMED.

Should you or I pass from this life with a little bad habit such as yours or my favorite sin? We have come to the "night of darkness wherein there can be no labor performed." We will not have our bodies during that time so we will not be able to repent.

34: YE CANNOT SAY, WHEN YE ARE BROUGHT TO THAT AWFUL CRISIS, THAT I WILL REPENT, THAT I WILL RETURN TO MY GOD. NAY YE CANNOT SAY THIS: FOR THAT SAME SPIRIT WHICH DOTH POSSESS YOUR BODIES AT THE TIME THAT YE GO OUT OF THIS LIFE, THAT SAME SPIRIT WILL HAVE POWER TO POSSESS YOUR BODY IN THAT ETERNAL WORLD.

The Gospel of Jesus Christ contains the most beautiful message, i.e. that you can repent now. And as it states in ISAIAH 1:18... THOUGH YOUR SINS BE AS SCARLET, THEY SHALL BE AS WHITE AS SNOW; THOUGH THEY BE RED AS CRIMSON THEY SHALL BE AS WOOL.

Don't labor over your burden of sin any longer.

MATTHEW 11:28-30

YOUNG WOMEN




