We should remember that we can still embark on new learning experiences at any time. Newspapers report each spring the commencement from high schools, colleges and universities of those in their 60's, 70's and even 80's. Age is no barrier. The only thing that matters is our interest and desire to learn something new.

The scriptures (D&C 93: 36) tell us that "the glory of God is intelligence", and teach that one thing we can take with us past this probationary state, besides the character which we develop, is our knowledge and intelligence. (D&C 130: 18-19).

There are many things we can turn our attention to. Some enjoy learning of history, geography, geology, astronomy, biology. Others are turned to politics, archeology, genealogy, literature, performing arts, etc. Whatever is "of good report" (13th Article of Faith) we can study, knowing that we will be further ahead in our path of progression. In D&C 88: 118, the Lord tells us "...seek ye diligently and teach one another words of wisdom; yea, seek ye out of the best books words of wisdom; seek learning, even by study and also by faith." Many times we can help others by sharing the insights which we have gained.

We should also take advantage of the opportunities we have to learn more of our Heavenly Father, and of His Son, our Redeemer. Each Sunday we have opportunities to be instructed. We can spend time with the scriptures each day. Many of our youth have the opportunity to attend seminary and institute. We have periodic adult seminars. In these and other settings we can learn more of the gospel, and of principles that will have eternal impact on our lives. It is important to have such a perspective, for the Lord warns us against learning without wisdom, and says "But to be learned is good if they hearken unto the counsels of God" (2 Nephi 9: 28-29).

It is my prayer that we can always enjoy the blessing of learning new things, both temporal and spiritual, and that we may find our lives enriched as we do so.
